SCAM ALERT FROM TRADING STANDARDS

The Trading Standards Team has been made aware of a suspicious telephone call being made to residents, supposedly on behalf of the Council, raising concerns over their current loft insulation.

Residents are advised that their loft insulation is insufficient and they could face criminal proceedings if they did not have it improved.

The caller tried to obtain personal information and bank account details from residents and also made attempts to arrange for someone to visit the resident's home to examine the loft insulation and discuss options.

Why Is Biggleswade creating a GI (green infrastructure) Plan and why now?

Living here in this old market town in rural Bedfordshire, we appreciate the open spaces and access routes surrounding us. But we also watch as green spaces and farmland are developed in this fast growing area situated in the middle of the Oxford/Cambridge ARC. We cannot stop economic progress, which will also bring many jobs to our area, but we can speak up for what is precious to us.

Through the emerging Neighbourhood Plan we can help protect the green spaces we most value, which is why we urge you to take part in the Green Infrastructure survey (see page 4) which will inform the Plan being developed over the coming months.

Our green spaces can be protected, but there is also opportunity for more land to be put aside for additional local facilities with potential funding available through planning gain and investment. It is important that the decision makers hear your views, to be able to build the evidence required to protect current sites and to develop new ones. SO PLEASE TAKE PART.

The Green Infrastructure Plan



Parish-level GI Plans are a statement of community intent which are mapped and entered into an action plan, which can be used by Town/Parish Councils, community groups, local environmental organisations and Local Authorities to bring forward improvements and inform planning decisions.

Biggleswade is currently developing a Neighbourhood Plan which also gives the opportunity for green spaces to be identified as important and, when meeting certain criteria, to be designated as 'Local Green Spaces' and protected against future development.

Neighbourhood Planning is a way local people can shape development of the communities in which they live. When finalised the Biggleswade Neighbourhood Plan will be a legal document and will be used alongside Central Bedfordshire Council's own Local Plan to determine planning applications, decide the locations for any new developments and promote measures to protect and enhance key environmental and heritage features.

Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity are undertaking this consultation and are asking the Biggleswade community to give their views on which local green spaces they particularly value by visiting <https://bedsrcc.org.uk/biggleswadegiplan> where you can view maps of current town's green spaces and take part in an on line survey, including your views on aspirational ideas.

The Green Infrastructure Plan (Cont)

Through the emerging Neighbourhood Plan we hope to protect as many of these sites as possible from future development by designating them as Local Green Spaces (LGS). Sites identified as important to the community will be assessed against set LGS criteria and those that meet the criteria will be put forward for protection.

(The original Biggleswade GI Plan in 2010 resulted in the development of the Biggleswade Green Wheel and enhancement of Jubilee Wood)

OUR FUTURE TOWN SURVEY

Community Place Making and Transport Planning

There is still time to take part in the survey being conducted by the Royal College of Art on behalf of Councils, civil society, charities, etc., which closes in November. They have held their first local Zoom meeting with residents and their researchers are currently visiting our local schools to obtain the views of younger people.

MISUSING A DP BADGE CAN BE EXPENSIVE!

A Central Bedfordshire resident found this out to his cost when he used his wife's Blue Badge to park in a Central Bedfordshire Council owned car park's disabled bay. He was fined £264 at Luton's Magistrates Court and ordered to pay a victim surcharge of £30 and costs of £335.50 - **a total cost to him of £629.50!**

A Blue Badge allows those in our communities who need them the most, the opportunity to park close to services and amenities. They must only be used by another person if the badge holder is either being dropped off or being collected.

Rules around Blue Badge use are very clear, and the Council has a zero-tolerance approach against this type of offence. If they catch people using badges inappropriately, they will take action.

Biggleswade Community Safety Group is working with the Council and the Community Policing unit to respond to concerns about speeding on Baden Powell Way. Two new illuminated signs have been installed and speeds are being monitored.
