BIGGLESWADE COMMUNITY ACTION DAY

Tuesday 10th August 10am-4pm

Central Bedfordshire Council's Community Safety Team are holding an Action Day in Biggleswade on August 10th with the aim of helping to build resilient communities. Their Community Safety, Highways,

Environmental Services, and Housing Services teams will be working together with Bedfordshire Police and Bedfordshire Fire Service, to carry out high visibility patrols, business visits, tidying of areas, fire prevention advice, as well as making noticeable improvements to the local area, in response to residents' feedback.

The team will be available on the Market Square from 10am to 3pm and can give out details of available support and advice services. It also gives their team an opportunity of meeting and hearing from the local community. You will be able to talk with representatives from various departments and with other organisations. There will be a litter pick around the town organised by Biggleswade Good Neighbours.

The teams held engagement meetings at the end of July to hear people's concerns and suggestions. Biggleswade Community Group, who produce this newsletter, posted those details online.

Biggleswade library is now open but the Covid secure arrangements are still continuing and you may find the layout changed. Visitors will be expected to scan their QR code or complete a Track and Trace form on entry and to wear face coverings while inside



the library (unless you are exempt) You will also be expected to sanitise your hands and please do not enter if you are feeling unwell or are self isolating. The number of visitors will be limited, so if possible please visit alone or in your household or support bubble. Essential computer usage is limited to 45 minutes per day and must be booked by phone on 0300 300 8055. You will need your library card to use our Self Service equipment. Study and reading areas and use of laptops or tablets are unavailable and magazines and newspapers are not available to read. Public toilets remain closed. Library activities and events will not be restarting at this time and staff will not be able to provide technical support to customers using library computers.

COVID UPDATE

Cases are rising quickly in the under 30 age group some of whom are not yet vaccinated or do not wish to take the jab. The local NHS and Central Beds Council are asking us all to encourage any young person you know to be vaccinated. Nearly 12% of those tested are proving positive up from 6.5% just two weeks ago. Biggleswade case numbers have risen from 48 a week to 102 over the same period; Potton 17 up to 44 and Sandy 10 up to 72, many in secondary schools. Deaths are still very low but hospital admissions fluctuate. Masks and social distancing will still be required in health settings, including dentists, etc.

Lateral flo testing is available at Chestnut Avenue car park Tuesdays to Fridays and now on Tuesdays in the Market Square. You can certify a negative lateral flo test by recording the code number on the NHS app, and you will get a negative text confirmation. If you test positive, you can order a PCR testing kit delivered to your door by phoning 119. PCR testing is also available at the old Days Inn Hotel site (previously Holiday Inn) on the Sandy roundabout on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

The vaccination site at Weatherley Centre is now closed but there is a drop in for Pfizer vaccinations at Biggleswade Hospital Site, Potton Road, between 9am and 3am each day. Astra Zeneca and Moderna jabs are available at the Rufus Centre, Flitwick 8.30am-5.30pm Wednesday and Thursday; 10am-5.30pm Sunday.

A reader has asked us to publicise the effects of Long Covid. One of our team is attending an online webinar and will report back in our next newsletter. But those who think they are suffering from Long Covid would like to see more recognition that this can be serious and can continue for some months.

First doses of the vaccine have slowed down considerably, so you are asked to stay vigilant by wearing masks indoors in crowded places, social distancing and sanitising or washing your hands regularly.

HOW COULD THE MOVE TO TWO TIER EDUCATION AFFECT YOUR CHILD'S SCHOOLING?

Below is how your child's school could be affected if the Council's preferred option is agreed. To take place between 2022 and 2024. The number attending each school is in brackets.

- Potton Middle School (184) and Potton Lower School (268) to amalgamate and become a primary
- All existing lower schools and Biggleswade Academy (922), currently a lower and middle school, to become primaries.
- A new primary school to be built on the land east of Biggleswade
- Possible options for Wrestlingworth CofE VC Lower School (54) and Dunton CofE VC Lower School (62), including amalgamation
- Edward Peake CofE VC Middle School (546) and Stratton Upper School (624) to become secondary schools
- A new secondary school to be built on land east of Biggleswade (on a different site to the new primary school)
- Lawnside Academy (213) would move to the vacated Edward Peake CofE VC Middle School
- There would be one Sixth Form open to pupils of both secondary schools (currently Stratton Upper School (624) and Edward Peake CofE VC Middle School (546).

Both St Andrews (CofE) lower schools have a total of 761 pupils with capacity for 900. The Biggleswade area is close to Cambridgeshire, which is a two-tier area, and Sandy has a secondary school. Increasingly pupils are leaving middle school early to attend secondary schools nearby. The schools in this area are a mixture of council maintained schools and 5 academies (which are independent of the Council). Stratton Upper School is the existing post-16 education provider.

RELOCATION OF MOUNT VERNON CANCER SERVICES

For some years the future of Mount Vernon Cancer Services (MVCC) at Northwood, Middlesex, HA62RN has been debated, as its estate is ageing and is no longer suitable. Community Engagement and online meetings are taking place to hear patients views about the proposed relocation of its services, to better serve patients from Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire. Best practice now is to link specialist cancer services with an acute hospital - either on the site itself or nearby. This improves the outcomes for patients with cancer. Log into https://mvccreview.nhs.uk/ to find out more and to give your views.

If your GP refers you to Lister hospital, (who run MVCC)it is likely you will be sent to Mount Vernon for specialist radiotherapy services, PET scans, etc required to establish your diagnosis and provide treatment. But it is now considered too long a journey, particularly for those needing perhaps 15+ sessions of radiotherapy.

If you are referred to Bedford Hospital, you are likely to be sent to Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge, where there is a standalone Cancer Centre and a car service supported by a local charity is usually available. Patients may not realise they have a choice as to where they attend their diagnostic services and then any treatment required. It is recommended you discuss any alternatives with your GP.

To better serve patients in Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire, including Biggleswade, it is proposed to transfer the specialist services at Mount Vernon to Watford Hospital where the service will be provided by a different Health Trust. In itself not always an easy journey, it is much closer to where many of those patients live. To help reduce patient numbers it is proposed to introduce a satellite service at either Lister Hospital or Luton and Dunstable Hospital, and this consultation is ongoing.
