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#### WHEN WILL TWO TIER SCHOOLS COME TO BIGGLESWADE?

Following Central Bedfordshire's recent consultation on moving from three tier to two tier education in Biggleswade and our surrounding area, no majority consensus has been obtained.

St Andrews' Lower Schools, as well as Sutton, Upper Caldecote and Northill Lower Schools strongly supported moving to become primary schools, but the Dunton and Wrestlingworth Lower Schools voted 91% to both remain on their current sites and become primary schools. The proposal was for one of them to close. Stratton Upper School endorsed becoming a secondary school. Central Bedfordshire Council are therefore revisiting their proposals to ensure they are viable and fit for purpose. The Council will then bring forward new proposals.

One change which will proceed - to close Potton Middle School and change Potton Lower School to become a primary school by September 2023.

The original Biggleswade proposals included the building of a new secondary school (ages 11yrs+) on the proposed site East of Biggleswade and towards which Central Bedfordshire Council had obtained £14m from the Housing Infrastructure Fund (HIF), as well as a new primary school in that area. Additional funding is expected to come from S.106 monies from the development of the Garden Village site which has not yet commenced.

Children at Busy Bees nursery rolled up their sleeves and showed their areen fingers to herbs plant and flowers at а community event. The tots teamed up with Grand Union Housing Group and The Hill Group, for the project, who also provided handmade,

recycled planters. The organisations are building a development in Sorrel Gardens, across the road from Busy Bees, set to provide 93 Extra Care apartments for the over 55s, 68 of which will be for social rent and 25 for shared ownership sale. It's part of Grand Union's mission to build more homes and stronger communities for better lives.

Karen Nicholson, Community Investment Manager at Grand Union, said: "The benefits of intergenerational work are clearly evidenced. I am really excited to see how we can develop such projects between our customers living in Sorrel Gardens and the children at the nursery." Mick Clarke, Site Manager at Hill, added: "Creating social value to the local community is a passion for us at Hill. This project has been a wonderful way to offer the children something educational and experimental, teaching them the joy of growing something from seed."

Laura Howard, Assistant Centre Director at Busy Bees at the Saxon Centre, said: "We are honoured to be able to have the opportunity to work with Grand Union Housing Group and the Hill Group. As a centre, we want to be able to help use recycled wood and make amazing projects out of these and teach the children about the community and how we can help others around us"

#### TOWN COUNCIL MATTERS UPDATING LOCAL PLAY AREAS

Biggleswade Town Council has now agreed its 5 year Play Area Equipment Strategy. With much work to do over the next 5 years they will bring the play areas up to date, including new equipment for all ages and abilities/disabilities. Funding will increase

over the coming years, and they will work closely with the surrounding communities. The Town Council also hopes to take over the play areas in Kings Reach over the lifetime of the strategy. They also intend holding a Community Day in the Market Square in early April 2022.

#### **BIGGLESWADE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

After nearly 3 years of deliberation and two community surveys, the final Biggleswade Neighbourhood Plan has been agreed by the Town Council and submitted to Central Bedfordshire. It will now be scrutinised by an Inspector. If any changes are suggested it will be returned to the Town Council for any changes, if the Town Council decides to do so. Once this procedure is finalised it will be brought back to the residents and businesses in Biggleswade, who will vote to accept or reject the Neighbourhood Plan, via a referendum expected around May or June 2022.

#### QUEEN'S JUBILEE WEEKEND 2nd TO 5th JUNE

A beacon will be lit in the Market Square at 9.45pm on Thursday evening, to mark the beginning of the Jubilee and again on Sunday to mark its end. Events will be held in the Market Square such as a Hog Roast etc. The Town Council are able to support community events, and street parties, bunting, etc.

#### SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT

The Town Council is working towards a presentation on a Sustainable Transport Corridor and to hear the community's ideas for improvements to East to West local travel. This work will take several months but it is hoped that proposals could be considered by the end of 2022.

#### LOCAL MUSEUM OF BIGGLESWADE

The Town Council is working with the Biggleswade History Society to find opportunities for either a short term or longer term museum in the town.

### **COVID UPDATE**



#### **COVID UPDATE**

Cases in Biggleswade have fallen from 240 a week as at 30<sup>th</sup> January to 107 at 13<sup>th</sup> February, with hospitalisations falling to the same range as in early

November. Cases proving positive have dropped from 20% to 14% but less testing is taking place.

Following questions to the Prime Minister in January, obtaining 4<sup>th</sup> jabs (boosters) for those who are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable (CEV) from covid, should have been improved and if you are on that list you should have received an invitation by text, email or letter. You should be able to take this to any vaccination centre, but particularly the walk in ones at the old Argos Store, Garden Square Shopping Centre, Robertson House, Stevenage, or at the Council Offices at Chicksands. If you received an unsolicited PCR priority testing kit, then you are more than likely to be on that list, as these PCR tests should ensure you receive the appropriate treatment, quickly, if you do test positive for covid. If you encounter any problems or have any questions, or think you should be eligible for that 4<sup>th</sup> booster jab, you can contact BLMK Clinical Commissioning Group (our local NHS) on 01525 624275 or email them at <u>blmkccg.contactus@nhs.net</u>

On 16<sup>th</sup> February, a statement was issued on vaccinating children aged 5-11 which read:

This advice on the offer of vaccination to 5 to 11-year olds who are not in a clinical risk group is considered by JCVI as a one-off pandemic response programme. As the COVID-19 pandemic moves further towards endemicity in the UK, JCVI will review whether, in the longer term, an offer of vaccination to this, and other paediatric age groups, continues to be advised.

2 smaller 10mcg doses of the Pfizer vaccine will be offered at 12 week intervals. The vaccine for children aged 5-11 who are clinically most vulnerable has been available since 30th January. At the time of writing there are no plans to carry out these vaccinations via schools, but this might change.
