The Amici Singers, founded in 1986 is a Ladies choir based in Biggleswade. They have just returned from a four-day tour in the West County where they sang two concerts and two church services in Bristol and Wells cathedrals as well as enjoying sight seeing and socialising.

On their return, they held their AGM to elect a committee to run the choir for the next year. Anne Bunker stood down after 11 years as chair and was warmly thanked for the superb work she has done. Elizabeth Gammell was elected as chair to follow Anne. The choir has a full programme of concerts and events planned up to 2025.

Bedfordshire charity **Carers in Bedfordshire** has won a national UK award. It was one of six winners in the **UK Charity Governance Awards 2023**, which were announced during a live ceremony in London on 8 June. The six winning charities each took home a prize of a £5,000 unrestricted grant. Carers in Bedfordshire are carefully considering where these unexpected funds can be best utilised to support unpaid carers.

Carers in Bedfordshire won the 'Transforming with Digital' award in recognition of the success of its digital transformation plan. After redeveloping the website, automating its registration service and streamlining its data reporting process, the charity has achieved a number of successes – registrations have increased by 60%; staff can now spend 33% more time on frontline services; and public engagement with the website has almost trebled. www.carersinbeds.org.uk

Electric Vehicle Charge Points for Residential Use



As part of Central Bedfordshire Council's work with BP Pulse, a project to install 96 new charge points is nearing completion. These residential charge points are spread over 12 sites across Central Bedfordshire, including **The Baulk Car Park, The Baulk,**

Biggleswade, SG18 0PU.

The project was supported by £360,000 of grant funding secured through the Government's On-Street Residential Charge Point Scheme. This complements the work being undertaken to meet the Government's targets on transport decarbonisation and net-zero, and seeks to address one of the objectives in the Council's Sustainability Plan.

The Council's residential charge point rollout seeks to:

- Provide access to local charge points for residents who do not have dedicated off-street parking, therefore unlikely to have home charging facilities or might not feel comfortable transitioning to an electric vehicle.
- Find sites within a 5 to 10 minute walk from resident's homes.
- Cater for existing and future demand without the need for further construction works and inconvenience on site.
- Provide access to public charging in as many towns and villages as possible.
- Balance the impact on existing parking at sites with the need to provide options for charging for local residents.

Anyone can use them, but their primary purpose is to provide access to local charge points within a 5 to 10 minute walk of The Baulk for residents who do not have dedicated off-street parking. Usually, these residents are unlikely to have home charging facilities or feel comfortable transitioning to an electric vehicle if there is nowhere to charge either at home, or near to home.

Wellbeing Project


