The End of Biggleswade Talking Newspaper

Sadly, the Biggleswade Talking Newspaper Committee have to report that, after more than 40 years of successful operation, it has become impossible to continue. The Covid pandemic caused a complete cessation of recordings of the local news in 2019.

Since then, there has been a drop in the number of listeners, and also volunteers. We believe that advances in technology have also contributed to the lack of requirement for this service. But the final straw was the removal of our recording studio for development by Central Beds Council.
