## **Biggleswade St Andrew's Country Fayre**



The Country Fayre takes place on Saturday 21st September at Biggleswade St Andrew's Church in Shortmead Street. Each year it is run to raise money for different charities. This time the focus is both international and local.

With **Water Aid** the church and its parishioners help to provide sanitation to those in need. You may remember the Great Biggleswade Loo Push back in February, which raised over £2,000 for Mafambisa Care Point, in South Africa. Well, the bathroom go-karting has moved to a different appliance. Two bathtubs turned go-karts will be pushed to open the Fayre in a fund raising effort. They will start from Biggleswade Town Centre, and head to the Fayre's arena. The scrubtacular race will start at 9:45am, with the Country Fayre officially starting at 10am.

**NOAH** (New Opportunities and Horizon) is a Luton based charity that works across Bedfordshire to provide support to the most vulnerable in our community

St Andrews annual Country Fayre has been taking place for 39 years. It has become an integral part of Biggleswade's community, history and a pride of the town. It brings locals together for some light entertainment, offering something for all the family whilst raising money for charities.

On the day there will be lots to see and do. The arena will have a rolling programme with various acts from the local community, from school choirs, dancers, majorettes, singing groups and more. There will be a BBQ and plenty of refreshments available. Inside the church there will be an exhibition on the charities that the Fayre is supporting. The event will end at about 3:30pm, with a grand draw in the arena.
