12pm to 1pm - Adult Carers dedicated time with your experienced Adult Carers Support Worker.

Mini pamper treatments such as footcare, haircuts or massages will be offered at the Biggleswade Hub from 10am to 1pm in September and December. You do not need to be attending the Hub session to book an appointment.

Take a break from your caring role, meet others in similar situations, learn carer coping tips and share your experiences. We look forward to welcoming you all.
