Recycle your real Christmas tree at any of our four recycling centres/tidy tips or by placing it near your recycling bin, on your normal recycling collection day, between Monday 6 January and Friday 17 January 2025.

This service is open to all households in Central Bedfordshire, at no extra cost to you.

Please ensure it is placed separately and not in any bin or bag trees should be no taller than 6ft, with trunks no greater than 3 inches in diameter

important reminder: For those who subscribe, no other garden waste will be accepted during this time. Garden waste collections are suspended between Monday, 2 December 2024 until Friday, 24 February 2025.

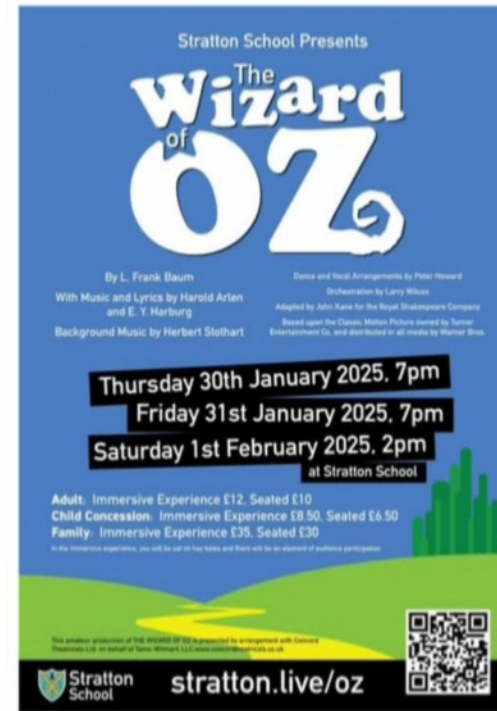

## UPDATES FROM LOCAL ORGANISATIONS



Bedfordshire Police want support for our Watch groups and promotion for their work. Biggleswade especially are looking for more volunteers.

**SPEEDWATCH** is a scheme to help people reduce traffic speeding through their neighbourhood. This is volunteers supported by Bedfordshire Police committing to at least 2 hours a month, using Police equipment to record the speed of vehicles, the data is then used by Police to advise drivers of excessive speeding.

**STREETWATCH** is run by local residents promoting good citizenship and supporting a stronger community. Patrols are completed in pairs for a minimum of 2 hours a month.
